FIRST THURSDAY FILM GROUP

November 1 For four First Thursdays of November, January, March and May Sr. Joan will show *Christianity: The First Two Thousand Years* a DVD program of 6 hours and 40 minutes – approximately 100 minutes each session. From the crucifixion to the crusades, the Reformation to the sweeping changes of Vatican II, the film takes a comprehensive look at the events and people who have influenced and been part of the epic journey that is the evolution of the faith. Drawing on the ancient texts, the Scriptures, commentary from renowned scholars, and visits to the multitude of sites where history was made, this film is the most complete account of the history of one of the world's most important religions. It chronicles not just the events and personalities that left indelible marks on the landscape of faith but also the forces behind them. FIRST THURSDAY BOOK GROUP – December 6 *To Kill a Mockingbird* by Harper Lee. The Unforgettable novel of a childhood in a sleepy southern town and the crisis of conscience that rocked it. This book became both an instant bookseller and a critical success when it was first published in 1960. It went on to win the Pulitzer prize in 1961 and was later made into an Academy Award winning film, also a classic. Compassionate, dramatic, and deeply moving, *To Kill a Mockingbird* takes readers to the roots of human behavior = to innocence and experience, kindness and cruelty, love and hatred, humor and pathos. Now with over 140 million copies in print and translated into forty languages, this regional story by a young Alabama woman claims universal appeal. 
